

Four Persist at Sea As Two More Finish

HAMILTON, BERMUDA (MAY 25, 2007) - *Lung Ta* sailed by Scott Jones and crew were the seventh race boat to arrive in Bermuda after the 777-mile trek from Charleston. With a competitive elapsed time of 5:21:19:37 aboard his Petersen 44, Jones sits first in his Spinnaker B class and second overall in the preliminary results of the Charleston to Bermuda yacht race. His partner in the Spinnaker B class, Jay Cook aboard *Tohidu*, crossed the finish line four and a half hours later with a competitive current standing 4th in the fleet, dangerously close to Kevin Hogan's C&C 44 *Kintaro* – currently in 3rd place overall.

Four race boats continue to stick it out with weather that has been less than cooperative. As of this morning's iBoat positions, *Dreamscape* appears to be at or near the finish line, while *Celadon* is 25 nm to finish, *Latitude Adjustment III* is 73.8 nm out, and *E's Alee* still has a whopping 148.1 nm from the finish line. The daily report from *E's Alee* yesterday was painful to read, as correspondent Will Haynie could not bare to write anything at all due to the brutal conditions.
